


beat the bug!







Attendance

May we please take this opportunity to remind you that when booking dental or medical appointments during the school day, where possible please book either first thing in the morning or last thing in the afternoon. If there is an

occasion where this is unavoidable, then please provide an appointment card or letter for our school records. We would also advise that there should not be any occasion where a medical appointment would result in a whole day's absence from school, and we ask that you please return your child to school as soon as possible after any appointment. Following these guidelines will help to maintain your child's overall attendance throughout the school year. Thank you for your continued support.

BEING ON TIME FOR SCHOOL

Students are encouraged to be on time, if not early, to school every day. Lessons begin at 8.30am, therefore students need to be in school before this. This is an important aspect of their development and will help their chances of success in the future. Therefore, failure to arrive to school or their lessons on time will result in a 15 minute detention at break time on the same day.

If a student is more than 15 minutes late to school on any day, they will automatically receive a 60 minute detention on the Thursday. Also, if a student is late three or more times in the same week, they will consequentially be issued with a 60 minute Thursday detention.


