# Year 10 Home Learning Curriculum Support

- Please see each subjects summary of home learning lessons for this half term. Our dedicated staff have created clear learning plans to support your child's academic progress. We hope that this information provides you with extra support and relevant material to enable your child to continue their learning. We ask that students work methodically through their lessons, where possible keeping to their weekly timetable.
- If your child is not able to complete a particular piece of work or task we encourage them to use this time to read and have included a link to challenging texts to support this. We also encourage that your child participates in exercise at least once a day too.
- We appreciate that there may be times it is difficult for your child to complete work, such as if they are unwell. We ask that you continue as normal to let the school know if your child is unwell by emailing [info@shoreham-academy.org](mailto:info@shoreham-academy.org) so we can ensure their teachers are aware.
- We ask that you support your child to submit the work they complete via Firefly or by following specific teacher instructions i.e email instead. This is to provide feedback and support them in their progress.
- Whilst we deeply value the need for academic study we **all** cannot underestimate the educational impact of some shared reading time, playing a musical instrument, cooking, playing board games and going out for your one form of exercise together as a family.
- We have added some curriculum links that would normally form part of our mentor and well being programme this half term including; discussion and debate ideas, links to assemblies and careers information.
- **In Year 10 students are studying valuable content for their GCSE's. We want to confirm that all lessons set will create work and support learning that will go toward your child's final GCSE grade. It is therefore imperative they are completing and submitting work to the best of their ability.**

Where can you find this subject's home learning lessons?	<b>In the Learning+ section of Firefly under Computer Science.</b>
What type of work is consistently set each week?	Work consists of resources to help the students learn or recap a topic, typically videos but could be presentations or documents. The students then complete tasks. The tasks could be a practice exam question or a worksheet. In addition on-line quizzes are set to help students to gauge their understanding.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	On the day of the timetabled lessons, currently Weds. & Fri.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	Up to 3 hours.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning.	Students will be directed to extension tasks when lessons are set on firefly

Where can you find this subjects home learning lessons?	Firefly – Year 10 learning + Health
What type of work is consistently set each week?	Activities, research, reading, contributing to the forum, preparations for assignment.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Tasks are set by the class teacher for the day of the lesson or that week. A deadline will be set for when work is due. Class teachers will also contact individual students for more work or to give support.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	2-3 hours.

What type of work is consistently set each week?	A typical home learning lesson for students will be quite similar to a lesson they would complete in school: 1. Complete Do Now Activity. 2. Record: title, date, keywords. 3. Use PowerPoint to learn about the topic – e.g. read/take notes, watch Youtube clips, read case studies. 4. Complete tasks set. 5. Complete Plenary activity. 6. Submit evidence
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Tasks are set when students have a lessons in school. Tuesday Period 3 (10.50-11.50) and Thursday (Double lesson) Period 2 and 3 (9.30 – 11.50).  Students should submit tasks by the end of the day, if they are unable they can email their teacher to explain the issue.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	3 hours per week. Students should complete and attempt as much of the work as they can.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning.	<b>Students will be directed to extension activities for the lessons set.</b>

# Year 10 English



Where can you find this subject's home learning lessons?	Tasks are set on Firefly. These will appear on your child's main Firefly page.
What type of work is consistently set each week?	For this half term, students will be focusing initially on their study of English language. This will include creative writing and analysing non-fiction writing. Students will then move on a study of poetry; this will be the Edexcel Conflict poetry anthology and includes 15 poems. Students will be reading, analysing and writing about these poems, as well as understanding their contextual backgrounds.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Tasks will be set in line with students' timetables, and work will be collected to be marked once each week. We will tell students clearly which pieces of work we need to be sent to us to be marked.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	1 hour.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning:	Make revision resources for the texts we've already covered ( <i>An Inspector Calls</i> , <i>Frankenstein</i> and <i>Macbeth</i> ). Creating flashcards of key quotations or theme/character mind-maps is a great place to start. Read their personal reading book. Use the BBC Bitesize website (especially the daily lessons appropriate to their year) to further their learning of English.

# Year 10 Geography



Where can you find this subject's home learning lessons?	The lessons are sent to pupils as a task on Firefly on the day that they have their geography lesson.
What type of work is consistently set each week?	Note taking, video clips, comprehension questions, exam questions, low stakes quizzes.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	They are set on the day your child has geography, your child is then expected to have submitted the work by midnight of that day. They are then checked in by the teacher the following day.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	One hour per lesson.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning.	If your child finishes the work within the hour they can access extra work on the Geography Learning+ page on Firefly.

What type of work is consistently set each week?	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Read or listen to a chapter of the book.</li><li>2) Complete the lesson which is on youtube. Activities include storyboards, creative writing, answering questions from the story and other things too. There is also an intro task to get you thinking and a plenary to recap what you've learnt.</li></ol>
When are the tasks set and collected in?	<p>There are tasks in each lesson (in the orange boxes).</p> <p>Tasks that you need to send in to teachers are in blue boxes. You will have one in the third lesson of each week (your last History lesson of the week.)</p>
How long should the set work take each week in total?	About an hour – including reading the story.

# Year 10 Maths



Where can you find this subject's home learning lessons?	Tasks will be set for you individually on Firefly – either for each individual lesson or at the start of the week. All instructions and resources needed will be set within the task although you may be directed to other sites such as Hegarty Maths or MyMaths to complete further work. Further work or resources will be added to the Year 10 Maths Learning + page. <a href="https://shoreham.fireflycloud.net/year-10-/maths">https://shoreham.fireflycloud.net/year-10-/maths</a>
What type of work is consistently set each week?	There will be a starter grid each lesson for you to complete and self assess. There may be a PowerPoint for you to work through or tasks set on Hegarty, MyMaths or worksheets that need to be completed.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Tasks could be set each day and submission by the end of the day or if set weekly tasks will be due by the end of your last lesson of the week.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	You will be expected to work for your maths 'hours' so you should aim to spend 4 hours a week on maths but you may want to spend longer if you wish you feel like you would like to finish a particular task that has been set.

You can find further work on the Year 10 Maths Learning + area or you can complete further tasks on Hegarty Maths. # Year 10 Media



Where can you find this subject's home learning lessons?	Every lesson is set on its usual day by the class teacher, and it is available in the student's Tasks section on Firefly/school e-mail. <a href="https://shoreham.fireflycloud.net/year-10-/media-studies">https://shoreham.fireflycloud.net/year-10-/media-studies</a>
What type of work is consistently set each week?	We are following our GCSE curriculum with tasks adapted appropriately, which may include: analysis, research, exam-style practice questions, tests, creative activities.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	At the end of every task, the student is told if they need to submit work or not (via Firefly/e-mail) and if/how feedback will be given. Students can submit work as a file or image. As a minimum, the student is expected to check the Task Complete on Firefly or e-mail the teacher to let them know the work has been done.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	Each lesson is designed to take approximately one hour. Three lessons are set per week.

What type of work is consistently set each week?	There are a variety of photography tasks set in order to compile a digital sketchbook in the form of a power point file. All students can access power point online by signing into office 365 with their normal school email account.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Tasks are set by individual class teacher for the day of the lesson. Evidence of the work is requested by teachers by the deadline set, and there may be tasks such as surveys that need to be completed straight away.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	Approximately three hours of work.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning.	Complete any improvement strategies given by the teacher in their feedback, revisit each task to check spelling and grammar, visit the Tate Gallery website and find photographers from the collection that relates to their current work and ideas in order to produce independent digital sketchbook pages.

What type of work is consistently set each week?	There will be both Unit 1 and Unit 2 work set. Unit 1 work will be revision using everlearner and Unit 2 work will be filling in sections of the rounders booklet.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	The rounders booklet work will be set on a Wednesday and will be due in on the Friday. There will also be some Unit 1 revision set some weeks just to keep it fresh in the moment. There will not be both set during the same week.

What type of work is consistently set each week?	A PowerPoint file for each lesson with tasks in the PowerPoint. Pupils are told in the firefly pages which tasks they should do. They should work slide by slide through the PowerPoint. There are often supporting videos and pupils may well have some key facts to write out, exam questions to answer and an educake quiz.
When are the tasks set and collected in?	Each lesson has tasks set, to be handed in that lesson or as soon as possible afterwards as we recognise it is not always possible to do it at that time / day.
How long should the set work take each week in total?	1 hour for each lesson making four hours of science a week.
Once my child has completed the set task they could complete these extra challenges to deepen their learning.
