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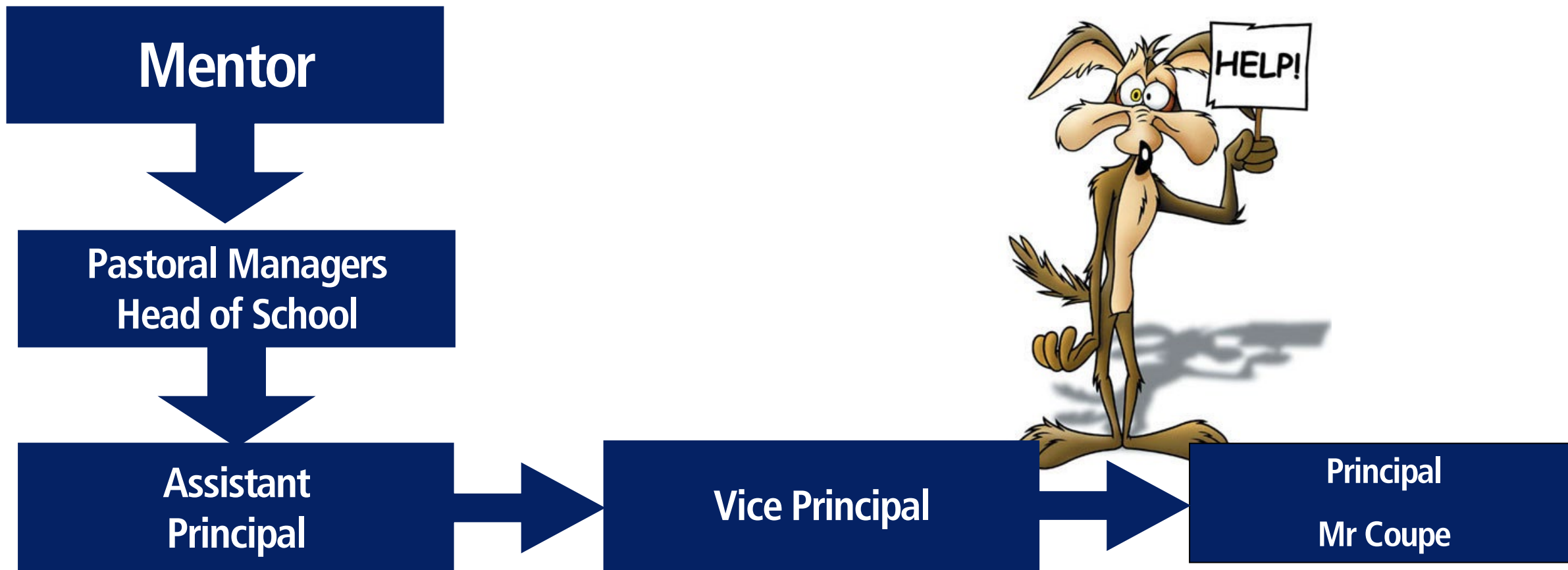

How is the Timetable Organised?

- There are 5 x 1-hour lessons every day plus a 30-minute mentor time.
- The school day starts at 8.30am (we expect everyone to be on time).
- The school day finishes at 3.00pm. This allows us to run extra-curricular activities such as:

 - Subject clubs,
 - Intervention.

- You will meet your mentor later



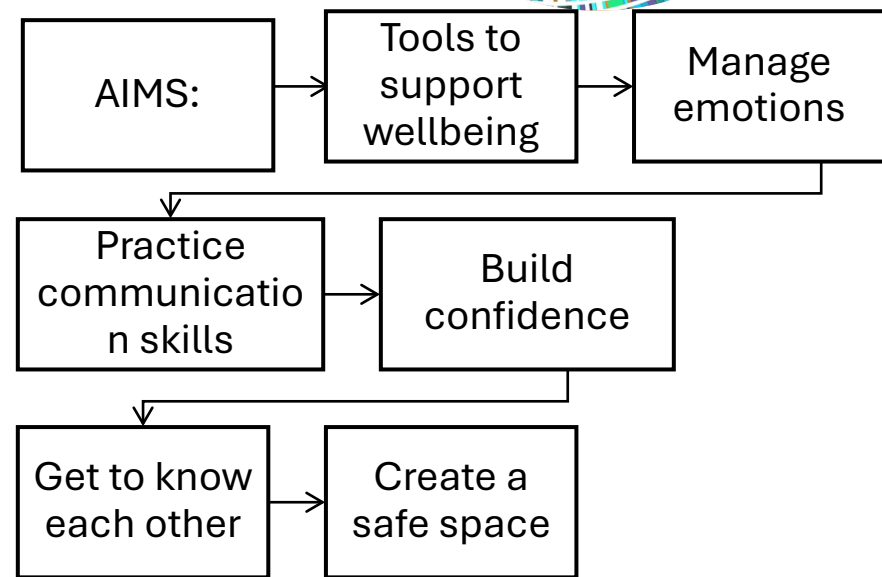
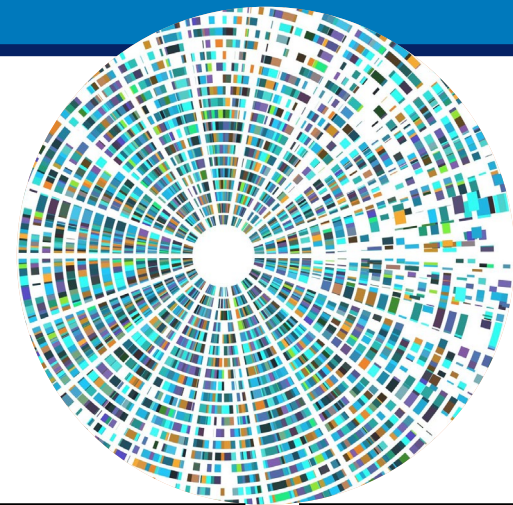
MINDFUL MENTOR PROGRAMME

This programme aims to support pupils with the transition from primary to secondary school. It will be delivered in mentor time on one morning a week. It draws on many different frameworks and is grounded in an embodied approach to mental health and the importance of building safety and community.

It will cover:

- Developing Grounding Resources & Support Networks
- Understanding Emotions and Emotional Regulation
- Coping with Anxiety and Overwhelm
- Self-Regulation Strategies
- Self Esteem and Self Confidence
- Reframing Negative Thinking
- Overcoming Challenges and Developing Resilience
- Putting it all into Practice

The assembly launch for students is on their induction day on 5th September. We will give parents further information on this programme at the settling in evening in September



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Uniform:

- Navy blue blazer with pale blue piping and school logo (boy and girl styles available).
- Pale blue school shirt (Years 7, 8 and 9) worn tucked in with the top button done up.
- White school shirt (Years 10 and 11), worn tucked in with the top button done up.
- Academy tie in house colours. Worn at 10 stripes in length.
- Black leather school shoes. There is no plimsoll alternative and no trainers. No plimsoll or trainer brands are permitted.
- Dark colour socks or white socks.
- Optional navy blue jumper with school logo.
- Navy blue school trousers or navy-blue tartan school skirt (worn at full length). If a skirt is worn pupils can wear black/natural tights but leggings are not permitted.



We do not allow:

- Excessive make-up
- Un-natural hair or nail colours
- Facial piercings
- No more than one pair of earrings, hoops no larger than a 10 pence piece
- Baseball caps or hoodies
- Non-school uniform jumpers
- Mobile phones - If you choose to bring one in, they are not to be seen/used, keep in your bag turned off.



School Uniform

- Hopefully, you have seen the uniform stand this evening
- The sooner you order the better...
 - You can order online and pay for delivery or select free collection at the uniform shop in Blatchington Road, Hove - or go to the shop and purchase uniform.
 - No 'last date for ordering'.
 - However, if your child is FSM and you would like to request discount, this must be done by Thursday 17th July so we can generate a letter for you to take to the uniform shop to use

Beat the rush!

Month	Shop Status
JUNE	Shop is quieter and fully stocked. This is the best time to buy.
JULY	Shop gets busy , especially at the end of July. For items needed for the start of term, please do not leave it later than 31st July.
AUG	Shop is extremely busy and stocks can run low, but we'll do our very best to help you and we put on extra staff for exchanges.

Reading at Shoreham Academy

- **Read together** Just because your child is at secondary school doesn't mean you have to stop the habit of enjoying a book together.
- **Read often** Just 20 minutes a day makes a real difference; please encourage your child to do this.
- **Talk about books** Ask your child about the book they're reading. Tell them about what you're reading.
- **Look for books that will engage your child** Find stories that centre around your child's interests and experience if they are reluctant readers.
- **Listen to audio books** There is research to show that our brains react the same way when listening to an audiobook as they do when reading. Many audio books can be accessed for free online and on local library websites, as well as paying for them via Audible, Spotify etc.
- **Subtitles** Put the subtitles on TV. **Evidence shows that subtitles cause automatic reading behaviour among children and adults. You don't have to consciously read them, just have them there, your brain will do the rest!**

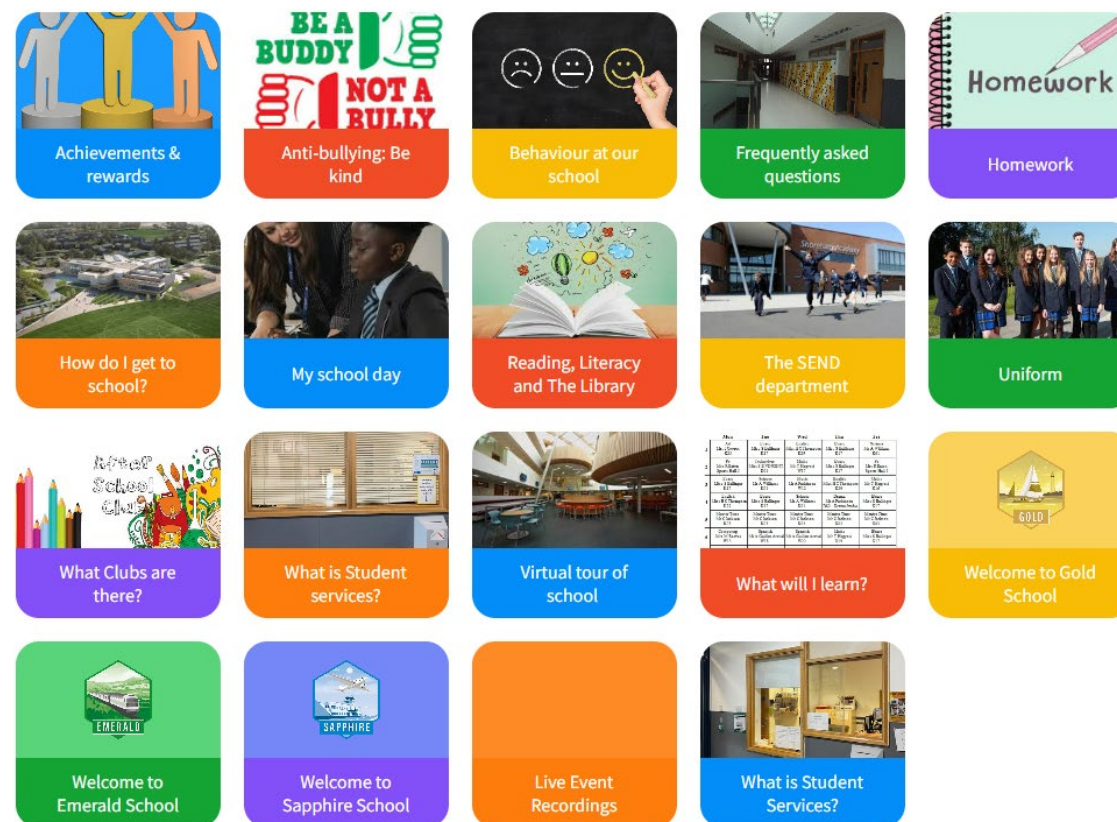
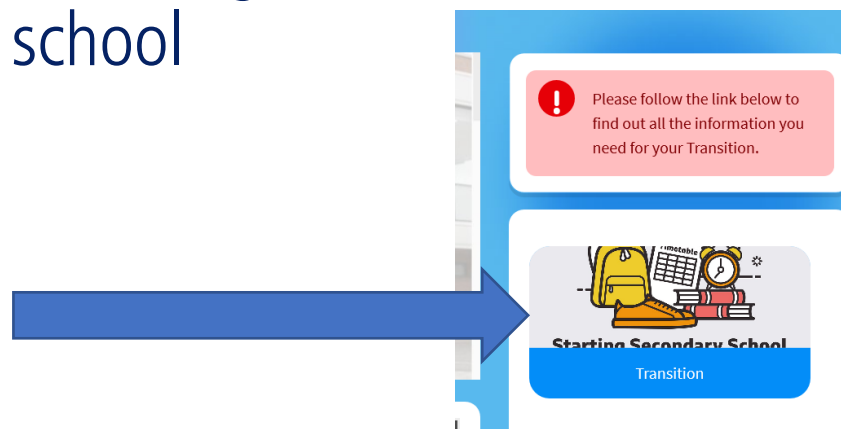
